The leading British newspaper publishes Which MBA? Full-time rankings 2022

The International MBA at EADA Business School moves up in the global ranking

- The school moves up 6 places in the worldwide ranking to number 56 and occupies the 12th position in Europe
- To be included in the ranking, *The Economist* requires all institutions to be EQUIS or AACSB accredited.
- Barcelona retains its global appeal for attracting talent with three schools in the ranking

Barcelona, 22nd June 2022. The International MBA at **EADA Business School** has received a global ranking position of 56 and moves up 6 places compared to 2021, according to the ranking published today by the leading British weekly newspaper **The Economist**. The MBA programme, which offers a global vision of companies, is designed for graduates with a minimum of 3 years professional experience to make a qualitative leap in their professional career.

The ranking was compiled using various parameters such as career opportunities, graduate salaries, participant diversity and quality of faculty, among others (see table). To be included in the ranking, **The Economist** requires that all institutions must be [EQUIS](#) or [AACSB](#) accredited.

According to Ella Boniuk, director of the International MBA, ***“our continuous commitment to a programme focused on sustainability, innovation and leadership has been recognised by our graduates, as well as companies and society”***.

EADA Business School Barcelona was founded in 1957 by a group of entrepreneurs and professionals as an ideologically and economically independent institution.
