Barcelona, September 8, 2025. EADA Business School's **International Master in Management** has reaffirmed its standing at **36th** in the annual *Financial Times* global ranking, consolidating its reputation as a benchmark programme in the top 40 worldwide.

"This recognition underscores EADA's commitment to academic excellence and to preparing outstanding global professionals for a highly competitive environment," said Antony Poole, Programme Director. "Our teaching model integrates rigour, diversity and sustainability, combining a strong academic foundation with a practical approach that is essential in today's labour market, which requires not only highly qualified professionals but also a responsible management mindset", emphasizes Poole.

The *Financial Times* ranking is based on a comprehensive analysis of factors including faculty quality, participant diversity, financial investment, employability, and career progression — in which EADA ranks **13th worldwide**. Other indicators include salary outcomes, international reputation, and global mobility, where the school has advanced to **17th place**.

EADA's International Master in Management is aimed at recent graduates and young professionals, supporting their entry into the labour market and accelerating career development. A clear reflection of its impact is that 97% of graduates are employed within three months of completing the programme.









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The ranking also highlights Barcelona's strength as one of the world's most competitive academic hubs. With **three business schools ranked among the global top 40** for this programme, the city stands alongside leading capitals such as Paris and London, further consolidating its reputation as a premier destination for management education.

To be eligible for inclusion in the ranking, schools must hold either **EQUIS** or **AACSB** accreditation.
